#### Opinion

#### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit of the consolidated financial results in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act). In case of Subsidiary company, the company has not collected/paid from/ to overseas parties aggregating to Rs. 53 lakhs out of 142.61 lakhs and Rs. 35.63 out of 45.63 lakhs respectively, which are outstanding for recovery/payment for a period more than 3 years as at 31/03/2022. These amounts have remained outstanding beyond period stipulated under Foreign Exchange Management Act('FEMA').
